I challenge you to reflect on your initiation into the Society and the honor and pride you felt when you were asked to become a member.

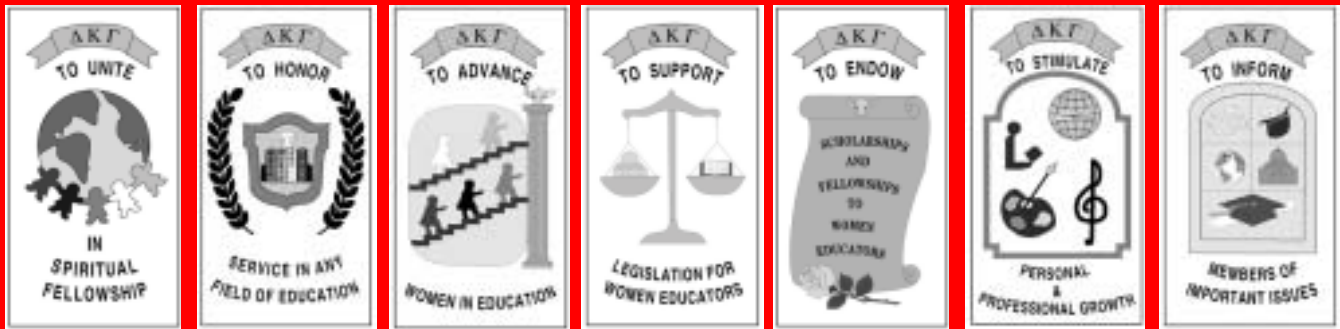
I challenge you to move your participation in chapter programs to the top of your “To Do” list. We have planned interesting meetings so try to attend.

World Fellowships History

The World Fellowships Program began in 1946 to aid women in war-torn countries. With financial assistance from ΔΚΓ members, four German women educators, spent eight weeks of study and visitation in Sweden in the spring of 1948. In 1952, Korean women educators were given funding.

Last year's silent auction raised \$120 for World Fellowships. Remember to bring in a vacation souvenir for the auction. You can buy auction tickets for any of the items during dinner. During the meeting, Carol Holland will pull an auction ticket and you might be going home with a prize. Your participation will make our contribution to World Fellowships a great success.

The Mermaid's Chair

Kidd is the author of the bestseller *Secret Life of Bees*. Her second novel, *The Mermaid's Chair*, begins with Jessie Sullivan being awakened by a phone call to horrifying news. Jessie's mother, who has never recovered from her husband's death 33 years earlier, has chopped off her own finger with a cleaver. Jessie is worried and apprehensive at the thought of returning to the small South Carolina barrier island where she grew up in the shadow of her beloved father's death and her mother's fanatical Catholicism. But she gets on the next plane, leaving behind her psychiatrist husband and college-age daughter.

The Mermaid's Chair explores many themes— but in an interesting way. I know this looks like an English class, but...

- Mid-life marriage crisis
- Crisis of faith
- Parental loss
- Mother-daughter relationship
- Leaving home to find home

The Mermaid's Chair has been dubbed emotional menopause by some reviewers. I thought it was a quick, smooth read and worth the time I spent reading it.

Good Eating

Shrimp New Orleans

Ingredients:

2 cups of cooled, cooked white rice
(Cook 1 cup of rice according to package directions to get 2 cups of cooked rice.)
1 head of cauliflower cut into small bite-sized florets.
2 carrots, shredded
1 green pepper, diced
3 green onions, sliced
20-30 pimento stuffed olives, halved
1 celery stalk, diced
2 cups of shrimp (drained, rinsed and mashed)
1/2 to 3/4 cup of Hellman's mayonnaise mixed with
1 teaspoon French dressing
1 teaspoon of hot sauce (optional)
Paprika
2 Tablespoons of Parsley
Salt and Pepper to taste

Procedure:

After rice has cooled, mix all of the above ingredients. Garnish with paprika. If the salad is made a day before, you may need to add more mayonnaise.
