Kids 4 Afghan Kids (6:30 - 7:30 p.m.)

Teaching students about diversity and the world around them can be a difficult task for educators. Northville teacher, Khris Nedam, and her sixth grade students took a unique approach in learning about Afghanistan. Her students discovered that the country had suffered a long drought, economic disruption due to the Soviet Union invasion, the Taliban rule, and the recent war. Students learned that children in many rural parts of Afghanistan had not had a school or access to a doctor in over 20 years. After understanding the hardships of Afghan children, Mrs. Nedam's students decided to be proactive and Kids 4 Afghan Kids was born. Under the guidance of their teacher, the students raised money and witnessed, via videotapes, internet and cell phones, the construction of a six-room school, a medical clinic, an orphanage, a bakery/kitchen, a guest house and community well for the residents of Wonkhai Valley, a mountainous area 3 hours southwest of Kabul. Come and be inspired by this unique and ongoing Social Studies project. Khris presented this session at the State Convention and was very well received by the members. **CEU Available**

Teen Dating Abuse (7:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.)

Teen Dating Abuse is a pattern of abusive behaviors that are used to gain power and control over a dating partner. Unhealthy relationship behaviors can start early and last a lifetime. Dating abuse occurs when harmful behaviors are repeated, creating a pattern of violence. According to recent research from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), one in eleven teens report being a victim of physical dating violence. Even more startling, adolescents who report experiencing dating violence are also more likely to report binge drinking, suicide attempts, physical fighting and current sexual activity. Mu Chapter has developed an effective program for educating students about this serious problem. Chicken Asparagus Casserole

Ingredients:

- 6 half breasts of chicken
- 4 T butter
- 3 hard boiled eggs
- 2 (15 oz) cans asparagus (or use fresh if in season)
- 1/2 cup mayo
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 T lemon juice
- 1 cup grated sharp cheese
- 25 Ritz crackers crumbled
- 3 T melted butter



Boil and cool chicken, bone if it's not boneless; keeping pieces large. Remove the skin.
Salt and pepper chicken to taste and sauté for 2-3 minutes in butter.

Slice eggs thinly.

Drain asparagus and spread in bottom of casserole

Top with layer of eggs, then chicken

Mix mayo, soup, lemon juice and cheese and pour over chicken

Sauté crackers in melted butter and sprinkle on top

Bake: 25 minutes at 350 degrees.


Seedlings News

In July, Seedlings passed the "one quarter of a century" mark as they celebrated 25 years of serving visually impaired children and their families. Although the past year presented challenges, they still found a number of things to celebrate:

- The 22nd annual Bowl-a-thon was the biggest and most successful so far
- Seedlings commemorated their 25th anniversary with an open house for friends and supporters. Gamma Alpha members helped with the celebration.
- Art Van Furniture Co. awarded us a \$10,000 grant to supply the Michigan Department of Education with Braille books for preschool children.
- We filled our largest order to date-1,733 books packed into 117 boxes. They passed the 300,000 mark in total number of books produced since they began. Some remarkable numbers:
 - 23,121 books & articles produced
 - 1,068,000 pages of Braille sent out
 - 1000+ titles in the 2010 catalog (5,429 or 23%
