
- In this love story, two mismatched seniors are forced into internet dating by their children. This romantic comedy proves you're never too old to be young.

Meeting Minutes

September 16, 2015

The meeting was held at Cassel's in Northville and started with "Sister Chat" at 5:30. Lynne Elsesser called the business meeting to order at 5:50.

Lynne distributed DKG Prospect cards to members and explained that they are a part of a new national initiative to expand membership. After we fill out cards, they may be returned to Lynne, Amy or Colleen.

Colleen moved to accept the minutes from the previous meeting with a correction to include the information regarding the "purple basket" being assembled for the Fall Conference. Approved.

Cindy presented the financial report. As of 7-1-15 a checking balance of \$691.70 was reported. With a motion from Jackie and a second from Amy, the report was accepted.

New chapter address books were distributed. Jackie suggested that all members contact her if a photo update is desired.

The outing to Tipping Point theater is planned for November 19. Ticket price will be \$23 or \$24. Purchase tickets at the October meeting.

As part of our support for Beverly House and Seedlings, Jackie proposed that we apply for a Wilma Adams grant so that we can secure two lanes in the Seedlings Bowl-a-thon and bring the Beverly House girls to bowl.

Jackie reported on her contact with Kids for Afghan Kids Project. The chapter decided to turn down a request to host a garage sale for the Project. Following a motion by Colleen and a second by Mary Jo, the chapter approved a donation of \$500 to Kids for Afghan Kids.

This year's Metro Council Luncheon will be at O.L. Sorrows Hall in Farmington Hills on April 9. A speaker will address the topic of "Caretakers of Alzheimer's Patients."

The chapter Birthday Dinner will be on May 18 at Courthouse Grille in Plymouth. Officers for the new biennium will be installed. Amy and Colleen agreed to be co-presidents. There was some discussion about combining the offices of vice-presidents into one office. Members are needed to fill the offices of vice-president and recording secretary.

Here's What's Cooking: Thai Peanut Dipping Sauce

- One 13 1/2 ounce full fat unsweetened coconut milk
- 2 ounces or 1/4 cup Thai red or Massaman curry paste
- 3/4 cup or a little more of unsweetened natural creamy peanut butter
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 to 3/4 cup of sugar (less seems better)
- 2 tablespoons apple cider or white vinegar (no other kind)
- 1/4 cup water

Put all ingredients into a heavy or medium heavy bottomed pot and bring to a gentle boil over medium heat.

Simmer 3 to 5 minutes; do not scorch

Cool to room temperature

Store in the refrigerator in a glass container

Keeps for a long time

I use it with chicken along with rice or regular noodles or spaghetti; good with skewers or grilled chicken or satay too.




Seven Purposes of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International
