

#### **LEGISLATION**

#### CHEERS AND JEERS

Senate Judiciary Committee ranking member Dianne Feinstein (D-CA) for pushing for the release of all documents pertaining to Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh's record to give the American people transparency on what could be a lifetime appointment to the highest court in the land.

Sens. Mark R. Warner (D-VA), Tim Kaine (D-VA), Susan Collins (R-ME), Chris Van Hollen (D-MD), and Mazie Hirono (D-HI) for introducing the Relocation Expense Parity Act to close a loophole, created by the tax bill passed last year, that prevents certain federal workers from being fully reimbursed for moving expenses.

Reps. Tony Cárdenas (D-CA) and Pete Olson (R-TX) for introducing the High School CODES Act, bipartisan legislation to help high schools create or expand coding education programs through a new grant program within the National Activities Fund at the U.S. Department of Education.

Reps. Cedric Richmond (D-LA), Danny K. Davis (D-IL), Frederica Wilson (D-FL), and Yvette Clarke (D-NY) for their letter decrying education secretary Betsy DeVos' decision to postpone issuing an Obama-era regulation on bias in special education: "The assertion from the Department that significant disproportionality occurs for reasons other than race ignores both the overwhelming evidence base and the statutory intent. ..."

Sens. Sherrod Brown (D-OH), Joe Manchin (D-WV),
Heidi Heitkamp (D-ND), Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Tina Smith (D-MN) and Reps. Debbie
Dingell (D-MI), Bobby Scott (D-VA), Richard
Neal (D-MA), and Donald Norcross (D-NJ) for
standing up for workers at risk of having their pensions
drastically reduced at a July 25 stakeholder hearing of the
Select Committee on Multiemployer Pension Plans.

Reps. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA), Dan Donovan (R-NY), David Joyce (R-OH), David McKinley (R-WV), and Chris Smith (R-NJ) for introducing H.R. 6445, an NEA-supported bill that underscores public-sector employees' legal right to form and join unions, and bargain collectively over wages, hours, and other terms and conditions of employment.

Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos for proposing to curtail loan forgiveness rules for students defrauded by for-profit colleges and setting a higher bar for sanctioning predatory institutions.

Republican members of the House Appropriations
Committee for rejecting a proposal to designate millions of dollars for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for research on gun violence.

- References to Roe v. Wade, the landmark 1973 Supreme Court case legalizing a women's right to reproductive freedom, are removed.

## **Teachers Matter: Emily Blunt - From Stutter to Stagecraft**



Most people know Emily Blunt as a Golden Globe-nominated film and stage actress. However, between the ages of 7 and 14 she developed a crippling stutter that had her struggling to even hold a simple conversation. "I was a smart kid and had a lot to say, but I just couldn't say it," she claimed in an interview for *W Magazine*. "I never thought I'd be able to sit and talk to someone like I'm talking to you right now."

For Blunt, it was one junior high teacher in particular that she claims helped her overcome her fear of speaking by encouraging her to try out for the school play. At first, Blunt resisted the idea, but the teacher wouldn't give up on her and coaxed her to take acting lessons and experiment with different accents and character voices to help express herself. In the end, those efforts paid off for her immensely. In addition to her incredibly successful career as an actress, she also became a member of the board of directors for the American Institute for Stuttering.
